

Bariatric Surgery Insurance Tip Sheet

Questions you should ask your insurance provider:

1.	Is there exclusion for morbid obesity (diagnosis code E66.01) on my policy?
2.	Is surgery for morbid obesity a covered benefit?
3.	What is the benefit level for the surgical treatment of morbid obesity? (80/20?, 60/40, etc.)
	In-Network benefit level Out-of-network benefit level
4.	Is Sleeve Gastrectomy a covered benefit (CPT code 437775)?
	a. Are there additional qualification criteria for the sleeve (BMI greater than 50)?
5.	Is Gastric Bypass a covered benefit (CPT code 43644)?
6.	What criteria must be met for approval?
7.	Do I need a psychiatric evaluation?
8.	Do I need a consultation or evaluation by a dietitian before insurance approval?
9.	Do I need a submit chart notes showing supervised weight loss attempts? If YES a. How many months?
	b. How recent should they be?
10.	Is there any specific testing that is required for approval? (e.g., blood work, cardiac clearance, ulcer screening)
11.	Will any additional information or record be needed by the insurance company?
12.	Insurance company name and phone number called:

Bariatric Surgery PREOPERATIVE INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Do not eat or drink after Midnight the night before surgery.
- 2. Do not take home medications the morning of surgery unless instructed otherwise by your surgeon.
- 3. Do shower with Hibicleanse. Follow the instructions listed on the bottle and below.
- 4. Required items to bring with you to the hospital on the day of surgery:
 - · Incentive Spirometer
 - Home C-Pap (Only if you have been prescribed to use one)
 - If you forget your C-pap, YOUR SURGERY MAY BE CANCELED until a later date.

Hibiclens Bathing Instructions

- · Shower with Hibicleanse two nights before surgery and the morning of surgery
- · Leave on the skin for two minutes before rinsing

Incentive Spirometer Instructions

- · After surgery, use this device every hour while awake during your hospital stay
- · Ask your nurse or respiratory therapist for assistance
