


What should I expect for my first visit?

The first appointment with your therapist will be approximately one hour long. You and your therapist will be in a private room where you will review your medical history and a health and movement screen will be performed. Depending on the condition being treated, an internal examination may be conducted. It's important to note, an internal examination is not required at this visit and can be performed during a follow up visit depending on your comfort level.

What is pelvic health therapy?

Pelvic health therapy is also known as women's health or pelvic floor therapy. It is a specialty of physical therapy that can treat various disorders of the pelvic floor.

What can a pelvic health therapist treat?

Some common conditions treated are general pelvic pain, pain with intercourse, urinary incontinence, and peripartum care. Other conditions include post operative care, low back pain, and SI joint pain.
